What is County Lines?

'County lines is the police term for urban gangs supplying drugs to suburban areas and market and coastal towns using dedicated mobile phone lines or "deal lines"

Features of County Lines:

- Drug dealing line
- Criminal Exploitation
- Trafficking/slavery
- Cuckooing
- Violence



Exploitation, Trafficking & Violence

- Exploitation is a form of abuse
- The grooming process is the same as other exploitative crimes, e.g.
 Child Sexual Exploitation, Child Criminal Exploitation etc.
- Gangs use young people to 'move' drugs & money
- Violence and the threat of violence is often used; for recruitment & if the drugs/money is missing.
- Weapons are sometimes used.

Cuckooing

- Base identified by organised crime group
- Properties of vulnerable people 'taken over'
- Force or coercion used
- Usually takes place in multi-occupancy or social housing properties

Signs & Indicators of Cuckooing

- People attending properties who aren't known by the occupant
- Occupant may seem in fear, or controlled, by the visitors
- Occupant may leave the property when visitors are present
- Weapons seen at the property
- Variety of vehicles attending the address
- Number of people coming or going, or someone other than the occupant staying at the property
- Increased activity ASB/Police/Ambulance etc.

Who is vulnerable?

- Children and young people usually 15-16 yrs old
- Males and females
- White British children
- Social media used for initial contact
- Class A drug users' properties identified for 'cuckooing'
- Power imbalance/form of exchange

Heightened vulnerability

- Previous experiences of neglect/abuse/exploitation
- Lack of safe/stable home environment/being in care
- Social isolation/difficulties
- Economic vulnerability
- Homelessness
- Associates
- Disability physical or learning

Signs to look out for

- Missing from school/home being found out of area
- Unexplained money, phones, clothing etc.
- Excessive texts/calls
- Unexplained injuries/self harming
- Carrying weapons
- Parental/school concerns
- Association with different groups/social networks



What to do:


- Dial 999 if there is immediate danger

- Report anonymously to Crimestoppers 0800 555 111 or www.crimestoppers-uk.org





