

# North Yorkshire and York MARAC Update – New Weekly Meeting Pilot August 2021

## MARAC needs to change


The number of cases heard at MARAC across North Yorkshire and York is increasing significantly. In 2020, there were 1420 cases discussed at MARAC across the Force area, which is a 37% increase in comparison to 2019.

The total number of cases discussed at MARAC has actually doubled over the most recent five years.

The impact of this rise on North Yorkshire Police and our partner agencies feels difficult to manage with MARAC in its current format.

Additional meetings in all areas (apart from York) are needing to be arranged at short notice to accommodate the increasing numbers of referrals. This is impacting on agency attendance and engagement.

# Introduction of a new Weekly MARAC Pilot across North Yorkshire starting on 13th September 2021

In order to meet this growing demand, and to manage the risk to vulnerable victims of domestic abuse, the DA JCG and the new MARAC Steering Group have agreed to a four month pilot, whereby MARACs in each area will be held on a weekly basis instead of fortnightly / monthly.

## Benefits of a Weekly MARAC

- Provide a dynamic response to domestic abuse and manage risks in a timely way.
- Reducing the length of the meeting will ensure that all cases are afforded the same level of focus and attention.
- Increased agency attendance and engagement by agencies providing resources to MARAC for short meetings rather than entire days.
