RoadPeace understands the importance of remembering family and friends who have died in a road crash. We organise the following:

World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims

August National Road Victim Month

During August, we organise the following Ceremonies of Remembrance:

■ RoadPeace Wood

This is an annual Ceremony of Remembrance held at the National Memorial Arboretum, Staffordshire on the second Saturday in August.

■ Remembrance of Diana, Princess of Wales and all crash victims, Liverpool

Organised by the RoadPeace North West local group, an annual service of remembrance is held on 31st August to remember Diana, Princess of Wales, who died on this day in 1997 in a car crash, and to remember all others killed on the roads.

Roadside Memorials

Remember Me plaques provide a roadside memorial that can be left to mark the site of a crash. Available from the RoadPeace office.

■ Befriender Service

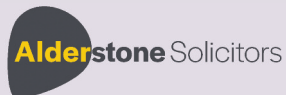
Offers ongoing telephone support through trained volunteers who have suffered a similar experience.
